



# ROBERT D. EDGREN HIGH SCHOOL CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES 2012-2013 CODE OF CONDUCT

## Requirements for participation in co-curricular activities:

1. Scholastic: According to DoDDS Pacific, students must maintain a 2.0 GPA and no more than one failing grade in order to participate in practice or competition. Students who are ineligible for three weeks during the season will be removed from the team.
2. A physical examination must be on file at Edgren High School prior to participating in any athletic activity, including try out and practice.
3. Students participating in EHS activities (practices, games, performances, etc) must be present in school for the full day on the day of the event or the day of travel. Activities occurring on Saturday require student attendance for the full day on Friday. Absences for all or part of the day require a parent written explanation and when requested agency verification. All verified absences must be cleared through the SAO prior to participation. Students who have missed all or part of the day due to illness will not be able to travel/participate unless cleared by medical authority. A student may not participate if suspended.
4. Participation in high school co-curricular activities is a privilege extended to students who agree to abide by the standard rules of conduct governing the program. Participants are expected to maintain the highest standards. All host school and host military installation rules must be observed. The Following behavior is not acceptable (however, other negative behavior not specifically mentioned will be dealt with accordingly). (DoDDS/DDESS Participants' CODE OF CONDUCT)
  - Possession or use of drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products
  - Possession or use of weapons
  - Abusive, vulgar language or behavior
  - Fighting and other physical, violent acts
  - Criminal misconduct, theft, vandalism, etc.
  - Sexual misconduct
  - Frequent school day absences
  - Misuse of government equipment and facilities, and misuse of the possessions of other participants
  - Personal attire and dress that is non-compliant with school and installation dress code guidelines
  - Violation of any installation regulations and host nation requirements
  - Travel in non-approved vehicles (friends or students from other schools) without sponsor permission
  - Unauthorized absence from designated locations
  - Violations of any school and installation policies or procedures

Participants who fail to uphold this high level of behavior, or who violate the standards of conduct, may be suspended from this activity for the remainder of the season.

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I understand that failure to exercise responsible behavior will result in dismissal from this activity. I may have free time during sponsored trips. During this free time an adult chaperone may not be in attendance. In no way does this change my responsibility to adhere to the code of conduct. Failure to uphold expected standards of behavior may result in suspension from the team. I have read and agree to abide by the above behavior code of conduct.
